After a short visit with Administrators, His Excellency proceeded to the gym for a meet and greet with the students and a surprise duet with our very own Andrea Tarusan/8C and Tyler Matanane/8A. We look forward every year to his Excellency's annual visit.



From the Class of '74.....

The SACS Class of '74 would like to congratulate our Alma Mater on its 50th Anniversary. Coincidentally, most of the graduating students from the class of '74 are also celebrating their 50th birthdays on the same year. It's this connection that appears to have instilled a bond between the SACS Class of '74 and our Alma Mater. It has created an inspiration for us to do as much as possible to help our school in ensuring its success.

Sometime in 2009, it was brought to our attention that Sister Doris was having difficulty in raising funds for the SACS Endowment Fund which was started in 2007 with a stated mission of using the proceeds for tuition scholarships for students who show financial need. As a Catholic school, SACS was limited in the types of fundraising activities that it was allowed to conduct such as hold raffles and bingos which severely limited SACS' ability to raise funds.

During a visit to Guam in late 2009, one of our fellow '74 grad from North Carolina, Eddie Vega presented Sister Doris with the idea of running a marathon to help raise money for the endowment fund. Eddie, who has previously, ran five other marathons volunteered to run in the LA Marathon on March 21, 2010. He was soon joined by a couple of first time marathoners; fellow '74 grads Vicky Eusebio-Klakken and Desi Cataluna, and a non-SACS affiliate Nilda Birch, all of whom volunteered to run in the San Diego Half-Marathon on June 6, 2010.

By the way, a full marathon is a distance of 26.2 miles and the half-marathon is 13.1 miles. For first time runners, a minimum training period of at least five months is required for the full marathon and three months for the half-marathon. By the time the training period and marathon has completed, one would have run more than 500 miles for the full marathon and over 250 miles for the half-marathon, a feat that only less than one tenth of one percent of the world's population have ever accomplished!

That's equivalent to only one in a thousand individuals worldwide. Yes, all four marathon runners are honored to belong to this elite group.

During the course of several months of actively soliciting pledges for our marathon charity runs, the SACS Class of '74 was able to collect a total of \$8,024.05 in donations. The amazing irony of this is that of the 78 donations that were received, 52 came from generous donors who had absolutely no affiliation with SACS. It is important to note that the marathon runners invested more than \$2,500.00 of their own personal funds to cover airfare, lodging, meals, rental car, and other miscellaneous expenses towards the marathon events. They did not receive, nor had any expectations, of receiving any reimbursements for their expenses, therefore, 100% of the donations collected all went towards the SACS Endowment Fund.

The highlight of our marathon fund raising activity culminated on the evening of October 23, 2010 when 22 of our fellow classmates from the Class of '74 attended the SACS 50th Anniversary Gala Dinner at the Sheraton Laguna Guam Resort. By the way, seven of those classmates flew in from the states just to attend this special event, namely: Vicky Eusebio-Kakken, Dr. Virgil Lopez, Leticia Kurashige, Eleanor Duenas-Legaspi, Margie Perez, Stella Baza-Bohnert and Eddie Vega. The entire SACS Class of '74 was showered with a dozen bottles of red wine since our graduating class had the most attendance during the gala. We occupied three tables for a total of 30 confirmed seats. We were also honored to have one of our fellow classmates, Lina Sanchez-Leon Guerrero, receive a special recognition award for having written the lyrics for the school Alma Mater song.

In conclusion, the SACS Class of '74 wishes to thank Saint Anthony Catholic School by taking an excerpt from our Alma Mater song:

*You give our lives a purpose,
Teaching to live, love and share.
Saint Anthony, for this we say "thank you"
For without you our lives would be through.*



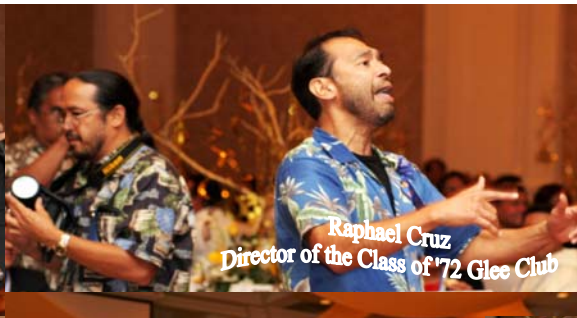

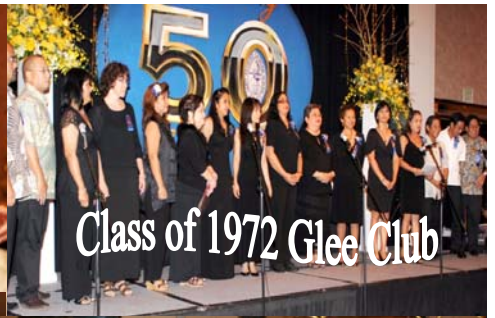

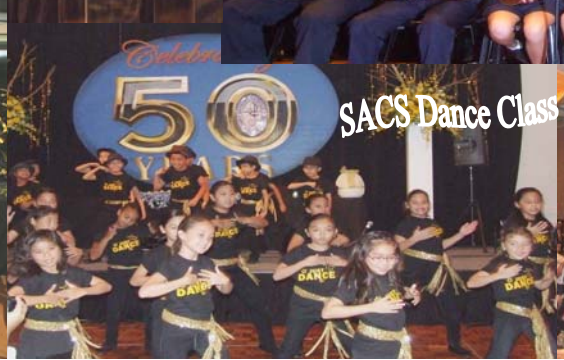
